





Our policies regarding student conduct are divided into two categories, Biblical Mandates and University Policies. Biblical Mandates are specific commands from God's Word which apply to a believer's life. 

PRIORITY CHECKLIST

- ❑ PLEASE MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO BE AT **ALL** SCHEDULED WOW EVENTS.
- ❑ Read all the hyperlinked material on the WOW section of the Master's U website for details and updates (go to www.masters.edu/student-life/wow).
- ❑ Read the *Master's U Student Handbook*, which can be found online by visiting www.masters.edu/handbook.
- ❑ Begin making travel arrangements for an Aug. 20 arrival.
- ❑ Return your Health Center medical forms.
- ❑ Share orientation materials with your parents or family so they can familiarize themselves with the same information.
- ❑ Check the online Academic Calendar before scheduling any holiday travel during the school year*. It is important that you plan carefully so you do not miss any classes or exams. If you have any questions about this, please contact the Registrar's Office at 661-362-2812.

**Please note that the spring semester begins with the first session of the Truth and Life Conference.*

- ❑ All students driving a motorized vehicle to campus (residents and commuters) must register with Campus Safety to receive a permit for the vehicle. You may pre-register your vehicle on MasterNet under "Vehicle Registration." Bring a print out of this completed registration form, along with proof of insurance and your vehicle registration to the Campus Safety kiosk on Saturday, Aug. 20 to receive a permit.
- ❑ If you plan to work on campus in any capacity, you will need to:
 1. Establish your identity (e.g. driver's license, school ID, etc.) **AND**
 2. Prove your employment eligibility (e.g. social security card, passport, birth certificate, etc.*)

*Please bring originals of all documents.

DORM FIRE CODE

The following rules are to be observed in the dorm areas in compliance with the Los Angeles County Fire Code:

1. There are to be no decorations on the ceilings.
2. There must be 12 inches of space between the ceiling and any combustible material placed on the walls.
3. For every five feet of continuous combustible decorations, a 12-inch separation needs to be made to help prevent the spread of fire.
4. No combustible decorations are to be placed on exit doors.
5. Christmas trees are not allowed in rooms, and only in lounges when they are sprayed with flame retardant material.
6. Curtains, blinds or drapes must be flame retardant material.
7. Unoccupied dorm room doors are not to be propped open.
8. Halls and stairwells must be clear of obstructions.
9. No extension cords are allowed (surge protectors may be used but not plugged into each other).
10. Floor heaters must be UL rated and kept away from flammable items.
11. Absolutely no burning candles/incense or open flames are to be used in the dorms.
12. Dorm hallway end doors cannot be propped open.

WHAT FURNISHINGS ARE PROVIDED FOR EACH STUDENT ?

bed with mattress
(extra-long twin)

wardrobe + dresser

desk + chair

carpeting

vertical or mini blinds
(drapes, curtains and other window treatments are not permitted)

limited amount of nails will be given by Resident Director upon request

WHAT SHOULD I BRING ?

bedding *(extra-long twin sheets, pillows + blankets), towels + washcloths*

shower caddy + shoes

alarm clock, hangers + wastebasket

utensils + a few dishes, depending on how much snacking you'll be doing in your dorm

ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO CONSIDER BRINGING:

small, non-halogen lamp

laundry baskets, detergents + rolls of quarters for laundry

iron + clothes-drying rack

plastic crates or storage bins

plants, posters + other decorations *(use sticky tack)*

hot pot and/or coffee maker *(UL listed, no open coil)*

secure lock for bicycle *(U-locks recommended)*

refrigerator - 3.6 cubic feet or smaller *(1 per room; must be plugged directly into wall outlet; should be checked by RA)*

WHAT SHOULD I NOT BRING?

drapes, curtains or other window treatments

pets other than goldfish or tropical fish *(aquarium limited in size to less than 20 gallons with stand); must have agreement of roommate(s)*

microwaves, toasters, or hot plates *(each hall has a microwave)*

waterbeds

nails, tacks, adhesive hooks, picture hangers or screws

upholstered furniture *(due to fire laws)*

combustible items such as dried flowers *(no lit candles or incense are allowed in residence halls)*

posters or decorations that encourage or support violation of The Master's University Policies *(no alcoholic beverages or advertisements permitted)*

What laundry facilities are available?

Each dorm has coin-operated machines. A washing machine load will cost \$1.50, and a dryer load will cost \$1.25.

Can I find out what my dorm is or who my roommate is?

We are very intentional about placing students, and we try to make each wing a good mix of various ages, interests, and majors. Because of this, you will find out who your roommate is and what dorm you are in when you arrive for WOW. We will be unable to give you that information before then.

Are there single rooms available?

No, but we are sure you will enjoy the community in the dorms.

Can I move into the dorm early?

Because of our staff training schedule, we will not be able to accommodate an early arrival.

Do you provide a shuttle service to the airport before or after WOW?

We only provide a pick-up service from the airport for the Week of Welcome (WOW). Finding a ride after that becomes the student's responsibility. Please contact the Admissions Department at 661.362.3363 to provide them with flight information.

Can I live off campus?

Students who live off campus must meet at least one of the following qualifications: living with parents, married, an academic senior or at least 22 years of age. You must complete an application that will be reviewed by the Deans' Office in order to receive approval to live off campus. The application can be found on Content Management through Self-Service under "Off-Campus Housing."

What if I forget something?

Don't worry! The campus is within three miles of Walmart, Kmart, and Target.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

REQUIRED HEALTH FORMS

- **New Student Health Record**
- **Copy of Immunization Records***
- **Copy of Medical Insurance Card (front and back)**

*Students requesting medical or personal exemptions from the required immunizations may fill out the immunization waiver.

REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS

Master's U's Health Center requires the following immunizations and documentation from new students:

- **Two doses of MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) or a blood test verifying immunity to measles, mumps and rubella**
- **Tuberculosis Test (Mantoux Only) within one year of admission to Master's U; if positive, must have a chest x-ray within two years of admission**
- **TDAP (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) within the last 10 years**
- **Two doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox)**
- **One dose of Meningitis on or after 16th birthday**
- **Three doses of Hepatitis B**

Note: Students who arrive early on campus (athletes) and have not completed their immunization requirements should report to the Health Center for assistance. There will be an Immunization Clinic on campus on Saturday, Aug. 20 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Students who are getting immunizations should report to the Nurse Station first before going to the Immunization Clinic.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

All students are required to be covered by medical insurance, whether it is through the University's medical insurance plan, your own insurance or a parent's policy. During the registration process, the University insurance premium will be charged to your account unless your insurance waiver is signed and approved online.

If you have HMO (Health Maintenance Organization) insurance or medical insurance, it is recommended that you call your insurance company and ask if you can be transferred to a local primary care physician in the Santa Clarita area prior to your arrival on campus. If you cannot transfer to a local doctor, if your HMO only covers you at home or if you have a high-deductible insurance, you may want to consider The Master's University Health Insurance plan. For more information, call the Health Center. The HMOs outside of your area (50 miles or more) only provide emergency room care, and it is very time consuming to wait hours to be seen for a non-emergency illness.

If you have Kaiser Insurance either in Northern California or in another state, call 888.778.5000 to request a Southern California record number prior to your arrival on campus. Kaiser has several facilities in the area.

If you have a PPO (Preferred Provider Option) or POS (Point of Service), you will be accepted at all medical facilities.

The Master's University student medical insurance is a self-service plan and easily accessed online. You will need to create an account online at masters.edu/campuslinks/healthservices.aspx (click on Master's U Insurance Information) to receive their insurance card. After you create your account you will have access to print a card, review statements, and search for providers.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION

Student Vehicle Policy: All motorized vehicles operated on campus by any student require registration with Campus Safety and the display of an appropriate permit. It is the responsibility of the student to obtain a permit by the end of the first week of classes.

How do I register a vehicle? As part of your online registration for the semester, you were asked if you intended to bring a vehicle to campus. If you indicated yes, you were prompted to fill in your vehicle information. Please bring your vehicle registration and proof of insurance to the Campus Safety table on WOW Saturday to receive your permit. The permits are not mailed to you. The vehicle registration process is not complete until you have placed the permit on your vehicle.

I did not submit vehicle information during fall registration but will have a vehicle; what do I do? Please log into the Self-Service and click on the Vehicle Registration link to submit your vehicle information. You should receive a confirmation email with your submitted information. Print this out and bring it to Campus Safety to obtain a parking permit. Vehicle registration is never complete until you go to Campus Safety and obtain a parking permit. The permits are not mailed to you.

How do I register a vehicle during the semester? See answer to previous question.

Can I have more than one vehicle? An individual student may only have one vehicle parked on campus at any given time but may register additional vehicles that may be driven to campus on occasion.

May I bring a car and motorcycle to campus? A separate permit is required for the motorcycle. If approved for this exception, the student will be assessed two registration fees. The motorcycle may only be parked in specific motorcycle parking areas by the dorms.

May I bring an electric scooter, other electric or battery-powered vehicle (hover board, motorized bicycle, self-propelled scooter/skateboard), or off-road vehicle to campus? No, you may only bring street-legal, state-registered and fully insured vehicles for use on or around campus. You may not park or store unregistered, uninsured, non-street-legal motorized vehicles or off-road vehicles.

May I bring my non-motorized skateboard or bicycle? Yes! These are acceptable, but skateboards have additional restrictions. You may ride a skateboard or bicycle on the sidewalks on lower campus; however, all of upper campus (by the dorms) is off limits, as are all parking lots on campus and surrounding roadways between campuses. Here is a good rule of thumb: skateboards cannot be ridden anywhere that cars park or drive on or around the campus. These rules help ensure greater safety and good neighbor relations!

I am borrowing a car for a few days; do I need to register it? Yes, but you do not register online. If you are only borrowing a car and do not intend to have it for the semester, you still need to register at the guard shack and receive a temporary use permit. Students are allowed three temporary use permits, but are then billed for a full semester registration fee.

REGISTRATION/PERMIT FEES

Vehicle Registration Fee: Master's U's vehicle registration fee is \$45 per semester. This is charged straight to your student account and any questions regarding paying this fee should be directed to Student Accounts. The registration fees are not prorated for late semester registration, nor refunded for out-of-service vehicles. The cost of a permit is covered within the primary vehicle registration costs, but additional vehicles registered and permitted will be assessed a \$5 fee.

Student Housing Status and Vehicle Permits: Permits are issued based on a student's housing status as an on-campus or off-campus student. A permit is valid only as long as you are a student and your vehicle and housing status remain the same. If you change vehicles, the permit is no longer valid and a new registration and permit is required. If you change housing status, you need to stop by Campus Safety to obtain a new permit. There are separate permits for resident and off-campus students, as different parking rules apply. You have until the end of the first week of class to obtain the appropriate permit. After this, parking citations and fines are charged for non-compliance.

Campus Safety Code: In the Master's U registration process, every student agrees to abide by the Campus Safety Code. All students are encouraged to read this code because it contains regulations that apply to all areas of campus life, not just vehicle operation. What is my student address?

What is my Master's U #?

Your Master's U # is your mailbox number. Mailbox numbers are issued by email during August provided the student has completed the registration process. You may access your mailbox combination, mailbox number and dorm information on Content Management by clicking on "Mailbox Info" (under heading "Students"). Your mailbox number is very important. Please notify everyone who will be sending you mail to include your mailbox number on all your mail. Mail received without your mailbox number will be delayed.

What is the best way to ship personal belongings from home?

- We recommend using UPS for your larger packages.
- Please keep packages under 50 pounds for ease in carrying them to the dorms.
- Packages should be corrugated with cushioning around items except for clothing and books.
- Packages should be firmly packed and taped with reinforced packing tape. Do not use rope, twine, masking tape or duct tape on packages.
- The Master's University cannot assume responsibility for items stolen or damaged during shipment. Therefore, make sure all of your packages are insured.
- Refer to www.ups.com for more packaging guidelines.
- If packages are not prepared correctly, UPS will not honor any claims against damage.
- A package slip will be placed in your mailbox the day a package arrives. Your packages maybe picked up in the Campus Mail Center as soon as you arrive; however, you may want to wait until you have checked in and have your room key so you won't have to carry them around.

ON-CAMPUS DINING

The food at The Master's University is provided by Bon Appétit Management Company. Bon Appétit believes that food service serves a much larger purpose for the community. Dining rooms and cafés are gathering places. Breaking bread together helps to create a sense of community and comfort. Bon Appétit recognizes the important role they fill and takes great care to honor their partnership.

MUSTANG GRILL

The Mustang Grill is a gathering place for the entire community and designed to showcase a wide range of flavorful, delicious offerings for breakfast, lunch, and dinner in an all-you-care-to-eat casual dining setting.

Visit Classics for traditional dishes such as macaroni and cheese or roasted turkey and garlic mashed potatoes. Exhibition features authentic global cuisine prepared right in front of your eyes. The made-to-order Deli offers a house roasted meats, so you can have your sandwich your way, and the Grill features fresh, ground chuck hamburgers and fresh, natural chicken breasts. The Mustang Grill also offers Greens, a salad bar abundant with local, fresh produce and Stock Pot featuring made-from-scratch soups.

Monday through Friday, the Mustang Grill offers breakfast, lunch, and dinner. On Saturdays, students can eat brunch and dinner. On Sundays, the Grill offers a continental breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

CANYON CAFÉ

This on-campus bistro features a range of grab & go wraps, salads and pastries, as well as a Starbucks-trained barista behind a full-service espresso bar. Flex Bucks, cash, debit and credit are accepted.

RESIDENT STUDENT DINING PLANS

- 20 Flex: The 20 Flex Dining Plan entitles you to any 20 meals per week, during most weeks, as well as \$150 Flex Bucks per semester.
- 14 Flex: The 14 Flex Dining Plan entitles you to any 14 meals per week, during most weeks, as well as \$150 Flex Bucks per semester.
- 10 Flex: The 10 Flex Dining Plan entitles you to any 10 meals per week, during most weeks, as well as \$150 Flex Bucks per semester.

The 20, 14 and 10 Dining Plans may also be purchased without Flex. Students sign up for their meal plan when they register. Using your Student ID card, Flex works like a debit card* and is accepted like cash at both the Mustang Grill and the Canyon Café.

*Please note that Flex Bucks can be carried over from the fall semester to the spring semester but must be used by the end of the spring semester or they expire.

CAMPUS SERVICES

MAIL CENTER

The Campus Mail Center is located in the Student Center. The customer service window is located inside the bookstore.

HOURS:

Mon, Wed, Fri: 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.
Tues and Thurs: 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Saturday: The customer service window is closed, but mail is put into mailboxes between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. The back door is also open for package pick up between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

Each traditional undergraduate student receives a mailbox to use for their time at Master's U. Your mailbox combination is emailed to you or can be found on Content Management. Your WOW leader will help you locate and access your mailbox in the Student Center.

HEALTH CENTER

The Health Center is located in the DCP 2 building between the Family & Consumer Sciences Center and DCP 1 on Placerita Canyon Road. It is right next to Placerita Bible Church.

STAFF: A professional registered nurse is available on campus year round, excluding holidays/weekends.

SERVICES: The Health Center is open to all full-time or part-time enrolled students to assist with:

- First aid, cuts, abrasions and burns
- Acute illness (i.e. fever, sore throat, sudden pain, vomiting and diarrhea)
- Consultation and referral to doctors and dentists

If you are sick and miss a class, please email or call the Health Center. We cannot write a note to excuse you from class, but it will verify that you are ill.

SELF-CARE FIRST + COLD CENTER

If the Health Center is closed and you have a cold or minor injury, you can visit the Self-Care Center located in the DCP 2 lounge. Follow the instructions on the wall, take your temperature and, if applicable, take over-the-counter medications or get first aid supplies. There is no fee for using the Self-Care First Aid and Cold Center.

FEES: Treatment or medication provided by the Health Center is free of charge. Students are responsible for any charges incurred by off-campus healthcare providers.

The Mustang Grill is located on the second story of the Student Center.

POWELL LIBRARY


