Application Process

Freshmen

- Apply Online masters.edu or The Common Application
- Pastor Recommendation
- Order official transcripts
- SAT, ACT, or CLT score submitted.
 - Test optional for admittance; required for President's scholarships.
 - SAT Code: **4411**
 - ACT Code: **0303**
- \$40 Application Fee Waived until November 1
 - Early action scholarship



Application Process

Transfer Students

(24 semester / 26 quarter credits completed)

- Apply Online masters.edu or The Common Application
- Pastor Recommendation
- Order official transcripts (from each school attended)
- \$40 Application Fee Waived until November 1
 - Early action scholarship

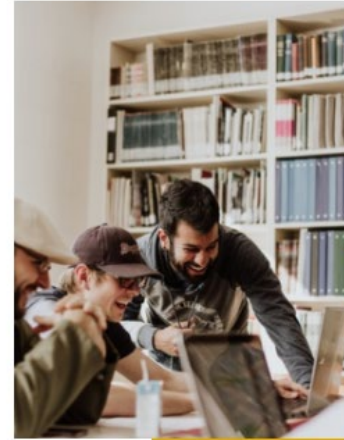

Financial Aid Terms

Scholarship: A merit-based money gift given on the basis of academics, athletics, musical skill, or other achievements.

Grant: A sum of money given to a student based on financial need.

Loan: A sum of money given to a student to be paid back with interest.

Work Study: A federal program that gives money upfront to students and is paid off through the semester.

How Do I Get Financial Aid?

1. Fill out the FAFSA.
2. Turn in all documents.
3. Complete Verification (if necessary).
4. Accept / Decline Award.



STEP 1

Fill out the FAFSA

- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Go to fafsa.ed.gov
- You'll need a FSA ID from fsaid.ed.gov
- Your FSA ID will give you access to personal records and it will act as an electronic signature.

More FAFSA info

- When applying for the 2023-2024 FAFSA, you will need your 2021 1040 Tax Return.
- If you are completing the FAFSA before you complete your taxes, then put your post recent information in and update the information later.
- Use our Federal School Code (**001220**) to send the results to The Master's University (name appears as The Master's College during current time of transition).
- Start your FAFSA as early as **October 1st**.

STEP 2

Turn in All Documents

- Check if everything is turned in with Self Service.
- Log onto **masters.edu/myAward**
- Click on the **Finances** tab, then click **Financial Aid**.

It's best to check online for missing documents, but our office will also contact you if we notice something is missing.

STEP 3

Complete Verification if Necessary

The Department of Education selects some students to verify that the information put in their FAFSA was correct. For details, navigate to masters.edu/verify to find our step-by-step guides for either the IRS Data Retrieval or ordering a Tax Transcript.

Two Ways to Verify:

1. IRS Data Retrieval – electronically check your tax information with FAFSA Information.
2. Send us a tax transcript – we manually check your information.

This example highlights a California Resident who is considered low income, and the student's parent is a full time pastor or missionary. This example also assumes the student secures a part-time on-campus job, directing their wages towards paying tuition.





CAL GRANT

A maximum grant of \$9,220

- Create a WebGrants account: mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov
- Complete the FAFSA
- Have your school submit your GPA to the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC)
- Submit your SAT or ACT score to CSAC
- The deadline to submit everything for Cal Grant is **March 2nd**
