8. Check the area behind the vehicle before operating in reverse. When backing up, do so slowly, and watch where you are going.
9. Make sure the direction indicator is in the correct position before attempting to start the vehicle.
10. Slow down before and during turns. Statistically, left turns are the more dangerous and when the majority of ejected passenger accidents happen.

10. Slow down before and during turns. Statistically left turns are the most dangerous and when the majority of ejected passenger accidents happen.
