

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

Go to fafsa.gov.

You'll need a FSA ID from studentaid.gov/fsa-id.

Your FSA ID will give you access to personal records, and it will act as an electronic signature.



More FAFSA Info

When applying for the 2023-2024 FAFSA, you will need your 2021 1040 Tax Return.

If you are completing the FAFSA before you complete your taxes, then provide your most recent information now and update the information later.

Use our Federal School Code (001220) to send the results to The Master's University (name appears as The Master's College during time of transition).

Start your FAFSA as early as October 1.

The deadline to submit everything for Cal Grant is March 2.
